The camp, for young people aged 18-21, involves paddling 200 kilometers through northwestern Ontario's boreal forest in twoperson canoes. Participants engage in all aspects of the trip, including cooking, setting up tents, paddling, and carrying equipment over seven portages. Maurus shared: "From learning essential survival and camping skills to navigating challenging portages and working as a team, every moment was rewarding and educational. Connecting with participants from diverse backgrounds opened my eyes to new perspectives and broadened my horizons."
